Scholarships

Winning a scholarship can be an effective way of helping to pay for your education.

Schools, universities and other educational institutions offer scholarships based on various criteria. These may be merit-based or related to the cultural or social background of students.

External institutions and benefactors also fund scholarships for various reasons, including needs-based or career specific.

Disadvantaged young people

You can search for grants available to young people living in South Australia on the GRANTassist website.

The Commonwealth Scholarships

Program provides support to eligible Indigenous higher education students with the general costs of study and support where they have had to move from a rural or remote area in order to study.

Government schools

Some government schools offer scholarships or awards that are usually sponsored by an organisation to help cover the cost of specific educational activities. In most cases it is for students already

attending the school. Talk to the principal to find out more.

In addition the STEM scholarship for high school students is available for students to pursue mathematics and science subjects

Rural and regional students

The Commonwealth Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships (RRES) program helps Australians in regional and remote areas to access higher education. It supports people studying from Certificate IV through to PhD level.

Study in regional locations

The Commonwealth Destination Australia scholarship program supports both Australian and international students to study in regional Australia. Scholarships are offered to support the study and living expenses associated with studying a Certificate IV to Doctorate level qualification at a regional campus of an eligible tertiary education provider.
